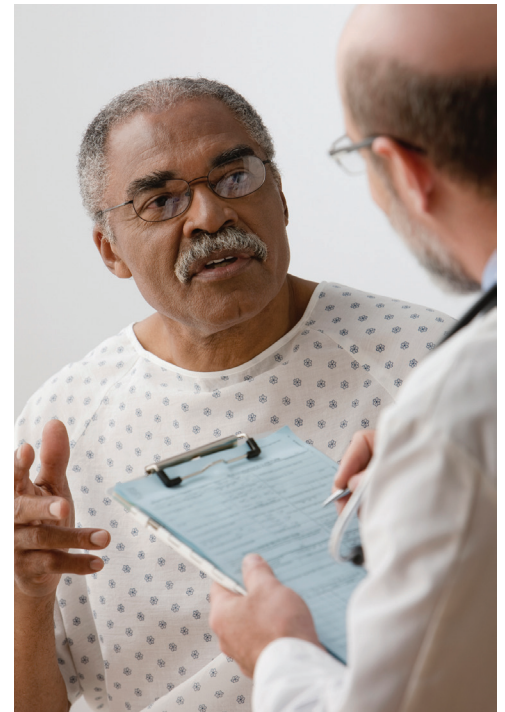


Prostate Cancer Every man should talk about it.

In 2009, 192,000 new cases were diagnosed and 27,000 men died from the disease. There is an increased risk of prostate cancer among African-Americans and men with a known family history of prostate cancer.

Education and awareness, as well as screening measures such as the prostate-specific antigen (PSA) test, which measures the level of PSA in the blood; and the digital rectal (DRE) examination have led to early diagnosis of cancer and more curable treatment to most patients.

Also, given the increased incidence of earlier diagnosis of prostate cancer, men are living longer with the disease.
